*During the final week of November, students and their families were invited to bring donations of canned food, toothpaste, toothbrushes, soap, t-shirts and cash donations in support of the project. Cash was forwarded to ADRA Canada, while other collected goods, along with the letters that the students wrote were shipped to the Central Philippine Union Conference in Cebu City, Philippines. CPUC will in turn bring it to the people who have been affected.

*Children in Grades 1-3 (Teachers: Mrs. Buhia, Ms. Leslie, and Ms. Kennedy) dedicated one morning to putting special "Someone in Canada is praying for you." labels on cans of food and other collected items. The label also included the scripture found in Isaiah 40:31: "But the people who trust the LORD will become strong again. They will rise up as an eagle in the

sky; they will run and not need rest; they will walk and not become tired."

*Students in Miss Stacy's Grade 6 helped to pack the boxes being sent to the Philippines. They also held a bake sale to raise more funds for ADRA.

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
